Contamination from COVID 19	Students, contamination from COVID 19 not maintaining social distancing	For all activities at Clare College 2m social distancing is required, with localised risk assessment and management measures taking this into consideration. Where 2m distancing between individuals is not possible, 1m distancing can be adopted, but only with other mitigating measures in place. These include the use of face-coverings, physical shields and barriers, and consideration for limited time at this distance, as per prevailing Public Health England guidelines. Communal areas within the College may have additional measures in place (such as 'one-way' routes, floor markings and signage for				

		behavioural reminders to social distancing). This is consistent with the measures required by government nationally as defined by the 'Covid-19-Secure' concept.				
Contamination from COVID 19	Students, contamination from COVID 19.	There is an expectation for all fellows, students, staff and visitors to Clare College to wear face-coverings in all buildings where 2m social distancing is not possible, except for specific medical exemptions and where lip-reading is required. There is an expectation you will always wear a face covering when entering the porters lodge, when you are in the library and collecting food from the Buttery. Face coverings will be worn in all in side communal areas of the College.				
Contamination from COVID 19	Students, contamination from COVID 19	The major protections to exposure and onward transmission of Covid-19 is afforded by the behaviour of individuals. To this end, throughout the College there is ready availability of hand-sanitisers and cleaning materials. The frequency of centrally managed cleaning regimes with approved cleaning materials has been enhanced at this time. Crucially individuals must adjust to the need for increased vigilance in personal hygiene, e.g. by cleaning shared use surfaces before and after use, and to take on				

		the responsibility that results from being part of the Clare College community.				
Contamination from COVID 19	Students, contamination from COVID 19 from touching surfaces	Students will be allocated a family unit when living at Clare College. This will normally be of 5 or 6 students (there may be exceptions to this), the students will share a gyp room, bathroom and toilet. There is an expectation that students will behave as if there college family unit is the same as a family household with the same government restrictions associated with this. The purpose of this is to reduce the transmission of COVID 19 in Clare College and the wider university.				
Contamination from COVID 19	Students, contamination from COVID 19.	As part of the College’s action to tackle coronavirus, we have introduced the Coronavirus Alert Service. This service enables the College to better provide support to students in isolation and to better locate any potential outbreaks of the virus within College accommodation. Students who should use this service include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Students who have symptoms of COVID - Students who have had a positive test result - Students who have been told to isolate by NHS Test and Trace

Contamination from COVID 19	Students, contamination from COVID 19. Students mental health	The plan is for us to continue to offer General and Wellbeing Clinics via video or telephone call, with appointments being released 24hrs in advance to help ensure our availability. A face to face consultation may be offered but ONLY following an initial online assessment, and when clinically deemed necessary. Guidance will be provided and recommended health & safety measures taken.				
Contamination from COVID 19	Students, contamination from COVID 19	All areas of the College such as the Buttery, Library, JCR and MCR have been risk assessed with appropriate COVID 19 measures put in place. All risk assessments have been placed on the College web page.
